UNDERSTANDING MAID IN OUR COMMUNITY

Meet one of our inspiring conference speakers, Dr. Francois Doiron is a GP who works at the Dingwall Clinic and has privileges at the Dryden Regional Health Centre. François Doiron, builder and farmer during the day and family doctor at night. "I started my practice here in Dryden in 2019. I have been providing MAiD since starting my practice".

He is passionate about ensuring patients and families receive customized care at the end of life and works closely with the interdisciplinary team to identify care options. Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD) is a complex and

very personal issue and Dr Doiron will present information intended to support people living with life-limiting illnesses together with families and caregivers in making informed decisions about their care. The presentation will review options for care, the process for exploring MAiD, and also a Q&A regarding the legal requirement/safeguards, what MAiD looks like and what considerations are helpful when making plans for end-of-life care.
